CADDAC ADHD Resource Map




#### **New 2020 Elementary Math Curriculum**

On June 23rd, The Ministry of Education introduced new math curriculum which contains five main areas of focus:

- Social emotional learning skills: developing confidence; learning to use a range of strategies to cope with challenges, think critically, and learn from mistakes
- Numbers: fundamental number skills, learning multiplication, and about fractions in earlier grades
- Algebra: learning about patterns, mathematic modelling, using math to make predictions
- Data: collecting, organizing, displaying and analyzing data to make convincing arguments, informed decisions and predictions
- Spatial sense: using measurement and geometry to describe and explore the world
- Financial literacy: developing skills and knowledge about the value and use of money

While the curriculum is sound, there is controversy over whether this is the appropriate time (with so many other health and learning considerations) to have such big changes.

# Don't Let "But my Kid is Smart!" prevent you from getting your Child Help for ADHD and Learning Issues

Of course your child is intelligent. Intelligence isn't the only skill needed to succeed in school. Learning in a classroom also requires skills that can be negatively impacted by ADHD, such as: turn taking, patience, thinking before speaking, completing tasks, organizing work, remembering important details. Similarly with LDs: your child is smart, but still needs tools and training to learn and perform to their potential.
