## <u>Updates from Local School Boards and Ontario Ministry of</u> Education

Wellington County School Boards have posted their school calendars for 2020/21. School will start on Tuesday September 8, 2020. There are currently still many unknowns about what format school will be this fall. Although we know what day school will start, there is still the possibility that school calendars could change, if School Boards are directed to provide blended learning with some days at school and some days at home. Waterloo Region School Boards and local French School Boards have not yet released their 2020/21 school Calendar.

#### Important dates in the school reopening process are:

- Week of July 27, 2020: Review of Board plans with Ministry
- Week of August 4, 2020:
  - Expected Ministry announcement regarding reopening model
  - Expected UGDSB release of Reopening Schools plan to staff and families
  - Anticipated Pre-Registration for parents regarding their plans for student attendance and busing knowing the approved model
- Week of Sept. 1, 2020: Staff training/planning for reopening implementation
- Sept. 8, 2020: First day of school for students (whether in class or online)
- Ongoing: Possible adjustments to the plan as directed by Ministry of Education and/or Public Health
